1. Stanley's motivation for writing the book is handing off the knowledge he has learned to

the next generation of leaders (2003, p. 11).

2. The five essentials for next-generation leaders are competence, courage, clarity,

coaching, and character (Stanley, 2003, pp. 11-12).

3. Narrowing down your focus on your work will help you become a better leader in the

long run. Applying the 80/20 rule allows leaders to determine what they need to work on

that will result in the most return on their time investment (Stanley, pp. 34-35).

Were these new concepts to you?

The concept of clarity over certainty was a new concept for me. Although he dives deeper

into the idea in the book's second half, he lays a foundation for the importance of having clarity

amid uncertainty. We often let uncertainty leave us paralyzed, but next-generation leaders need

to learn to be clear even when they do not have all the facts (Stanley, 2003, p. 12).

What was the real "aha" moment for you in this reading?

My aha moment in this reading was when the author talked about the fact that although

he is a pastor, he places a much bigger emphasis on his communication skills because that

greatly impacts his organization as a whole (Stanley, 2003, p. 36). He is a mega church pastor

and has a different style of leading the people that call his church home. I am sure Northpoint

Church has people dedicated to fulfilling pastoral responsibilities like hospital visits and care

during tough circumstances. Because of the organization's size, the main pastor cannot get to every hospital visit. Still, he does make it a priority for the organization to have someone to cover those responsibilities and for someone to have the pulse of the congregation's needs.
